- The prime Minister of Thailand has approved the use of DON MUANG as staging area for humanitarian cargo direct to Myanmar.

- Labutta: the public work department is planning to construct bailey bridges for the replacement of wooden bridge. They are also renovating/strengthening the Nyaung Chaung bridge which is currently in bad conditions.
